) VOLUNTARY SURRENDER OF
) LICENSE FOR SUSPENSION

This document is a Consent Agreement whereby the Maine Board of Registration in Medicine is agreeing to accept the voluntary surrender for suspension of John B. Hunt, M.D.'s license to practice medicine in the State of Maine. This voluntary suspension is being made pursuant to 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5) and 32 M.R.S.A. § 3282-A(2)(B).

Dr. Hunt understands and agrees that he shall not practice medicine in the State of Maine until such time as he has applied for and received Board approval for this suspension to be lifted.

In support of Dr. Hunt's voluntary suspension of his license, Dr. Hunt would note the following facts: that he entered treatment at Anchor Hospital in Atlanta on February 8, 1993; that he was in treatment at Talbott-Marsh Recovery Campus in Atlanta, Georgia from February 17, 1993 to July 3, 1993, when he was discharged; that he continues to be monitored on an out-patient basis; that he has remained abstinent since entering treatment; that he is in compliance with the recovery contract which he executed with Talbott-Marsh; and that he is in compliance with the continuing care contract which he recently executed with the Medical Society of Virginia's Physician's Health and Effectiveness Committee, which currently is monitoring Dr. Hunt's recovery. Dr. Hunt also is enrolled in the

Florida Impaired Physicians Program, and is remaining in contact with Dr. Dalco as an enrollee in the Maine Medical Association's Committee on Physician Health. In further support of this Consent Agreement, Dr. Hunt is submitting a June 25, 1993 report from Barry H. Lubin, M.D., Director of Continuing Care of Talbott-Marsh.

Dr. Hunt currently is not practicing medicine in any jurisdiction, and he has agreed to voluntarily surrender his controlled substances privileges to the D.E.A., which currently is in process.

Upon application by Dr. Hunt to lift the suspension, Dr. Hunt agrees to provide the Board details of his treatment and recovery program, along with details of monitoring and aftercare. Dr. Hunt agrees to make himself available to the Board for questions and to participate in the Maine Medical Association's Committee on Physician Health.

The Board retains the right to take any enforcement action authorized by 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5)(A-1) and/or 32 M.R.S.A. § 3282-A against Dr. Hunt as a result of his substance abuse.

I, JOHN B. HUNT, M.D., HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE FOREGOING CONSENT AGREEMENT. I UNDERSTAND THAT BY SIGNING IT, I WAIVE CERTAIN RIGHTS. I SIGN IT VOLUNTARILY, WITHOUT ANY THREAT OR PROMISE. I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS CONSENT AGREEMENT CONTAINS THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT, AND THERE IS NO OTHER AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND, WRITTEN, VERBAL OR OTHERWISE.


