) CONSENT AGREEMENT

This document is a Consent Agreement entered into by Anastacio T. Salvador, M.D. ("the Licensee"), the State of Maine Board of Licensure in Medicine ("the Board") and the State of Maine Department of the Attorney General, pursuant to 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5) and 32 M.R.S.A. § 3282-A and § 3271(5).

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

In June, 1992, Dr. Salvador applied for and received a renewal of his Maine medical license in inactive status. In December, 1992, the Board received an adverse action report from the United States Air Force Office of Surgeon General regarding Dr. Salvador. The report stated that Dr. Salvador emergency room privileges had been removed "due to a trend of difficulties with care of complex and/or emergent cases." The Licensee had been limited to out-patient privileges and was practicing under supervision for six months.

On March 9, 1993, the Board considered the adverse action report and concluded that there was no need for further action because Dr. Salvador held an inactive Maine medical license. This report was filed by the Board. Dr. Salvador's inactive license was renewed in 1994.

In March, 1995, Dr. Salvador applied for active registration of his Maine medical license. At that time, Dr. Salvador had left the military and was working as

a civilian for the military in a military enlistment processing station. He continues to work in that position in North Carolina and does not treat patients. His work consists of doing physical examinations for enlistment purposes. There is no treatment or inpatient care involved in his work.

AGREEMENT

The Board finds that there are sufficient facts to warrant attaching conditions to Dr. Salvador's Maine medical license as it is converted from inactive to active status. The Board further finds that a Consent Agreement will protect the citizens of the State of Maine by conditioning Dr. Salvador's license to practice in Maine by the terms of this agreement:

1. Upon receipt of an assignment or offer of employment to practice medicine in Maine, Dr. Salvador shall notify the Board in writing of his intentions to accept such assignment or offer, the location of the position or practice assigned or offered, the nature of the position or practice, the name of the supervising physician and a description of the manner and extent of supervision contemplated.

2. In the event that Dr. Salvador accepts an offer of employment in Maine which is outside the military enlistment processing program in which he is now employed, Dr. Salvador will meet the following conditions:

- a. He will take and pass the SPEX examinations;
- b. He will be supervised for a period of one year by a physician who must be approved by the Board. The supervising physician will monitor Dr. Salvador's practice, perform retrospective chart

review and provide the Board with quarterly reports.


3. Dr. Salvador shall not start working in such position or practice unless and until the arrangement is described in his notice to the Board has been approved by the Board in writing. Dr. Salvador shall notify the Board in writing of any changes to the position or practice arrangement as approved. Such notification shall be made as soon as possible after Dr. Salvador learns of such changes but not later than 48 hours prior to the changes taking affect. Dr. Salvador shall immediately cease practicing in the event that the Board notifies them in writing that the changes are not acceptable.

4. This agreement and the fact that Dr. Salvador's Maine physician's license is subject to the conditions set forth herein and shall constitute a final action of the Board. Dr. Salvador may seek removal or modification of the conditions imposed by this agreement upon his license by written petition to the Board.

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to deny the Board jurisdiction to investigate further alleged violations of law or complaints received by the Board which are unknown at this time or that are not covered under the conditions of this agreement.


Dr. Salvador waives his right to a hearing before the Board or any court regarding all terms and conditions of this Consent Agreement. He has had the opportunity to be advised by counsel with respect to the terms of this agreement.
